LVC (ph) on (inaudible - 00:02:34) 215, um, in reference to a battery call, um, and that's where I contacted, uh, Mr. Robert Moos and, uh, Mr. Russell Martin there on LVC near the racquetball courts. I made contact with Robert, um, who stated that he was on the side of the racquetball courts at LVC. Uh, he spoke to Mr. Russell. Um, basically they had an argument, uh, in reference to who was in line or who was next in line to play on the court. Um, during this, uh, argument I was told by witnesses, um, that Robert had pushed -- sorry, give me one second here -um, that, uh, that Robert had his face pushed up against the wall. Um, I believe he was wearing a baseball cap. It was the front part of his face that was pushed. Um, when he got -- Robert got pushed, um, he had a reaction with his arm. Basically his arm swung and he had a racquetball, uh, racquet in his hand. Um, the altercation ensued. Uh, Russell then swung his, uh, tennis racquet striking Robert on the top of his head. Uh, there was a cut that Robert had to go to the hospital to, uh, get treated, um, and pictures were taking -- were taken by our crime scene analysist as well of that. Um, I then conducted my interview with Russell. Um, he was, he was advised of Miranda Rights, um, before asked any questions.

Russell stated that he was waiting for the racquetball He actually, um, claimed that he wrote his name on the (inaudible - 00:04:19), uh, stating he was next in line. Uh, same thing, argument ensued. um, basically my interview with Russell showed that -he stated that Robert got too close to him while they were arguing. Um, he had put his arm out to push Robert away, um, to give him space 'cause it was an argument. Um, with this, uh, he pushed his baseball cap down. R. Moos: Thank you, Officer. To start with, the incident happened on September the 9th. I believe the officer said September the 19th. He also indicated that, uh, the weapon used was a tennis racket when in fact they were racquetball racquets. Uh, also on September the 9th, um, around 3:30, 3:50 I signed up on the racquetball challenge court board. Challenge court starts at 4:00. Uh, I was the first one to sign up on the board, uh, so my name was the only one so we could start challenge court 4:00. Uh, two ma- -- two other members came in, uh, two members named Chris and Paul came in and they signed up on the board, so there was three of us on the board. And while I was -- while we were waiting for a fourth player to show up I told, uh, Chris and Paul to go ahead and play a warmup game until we get a fourth player. During their warmup game, a fourth player by the name of -- another member by the name of Kent came in. He signed up on the

So we had enough to play doubles, and we were just waiting for Chris and Paul to finish their, their warmup game. During that time, uh, near the end of Chris and Paul's warmup game Russell showed up and he erased the names of Chris and Paul. He rewrote my name first, Kent's name second, and his name third. told, uh, Russell that we have four for the first game of, uh, doubles. He told me that well they can't play 'cause they're playing now. So he went down to sit down near the end of the bench, and I went back up and I rewrote the names in the order that they should be. My name first, Chris and Paul's name, and then Kent's name. I went into the court after Chris and Paul ended their warmup game, and I started to -- uh, well I warmed up for maybe five minutes. I started to come out of the court and Russell started to come into the court and I -- he came right up to me nose-to-nose, and I, I told him that we have the first four to start challenge court. And he started yelling at me noseto-nose that -- indicating that they can't play 'cause they just finished. Well they just finished their singles game, so we were getting ready to start the doubles game and we already had our four players to, uh, start the doubles game. Russell was nose-to-nose He took his hand, his -- I believe it was his, to me.

The four of us are going to play the game. I let it alone. I remember I didn't react to it. I went over and sat down. is only about five feet between the bench and going into the racquetball courts. The game finished. came out and Chris came and sat next to me. Chris was talking to me saying that he didn't want to play anymore. This case (inaudible - 00:12:58) the game playing list and it needs only four which means I'm the next one up to play. So I said to Chris, Chris you still can. If you want to continue playing and you guys want to play, I'm all good for it, and I'll sit and wait for the other game. He goes no. want to. And I watched the game. He was getting his butt kicked. So I got up, and as I got up and my head was down and I was just walking into the courts 'cause it's the normal thing to do. Rob -- Bob gave the testimony that he was already in the courtroom, so why did he come out of that courtroom and step in front of It was because he wanted to impress his power upon me again, and the first thing out of his mouth was you're not playing. And I said to Bob, Chris

doesn't want to play. He says it again to me as he comes in closer. You're not playing. Everybody behind me including Chris yells at Bob. Russ is the next guy up to play. I'm thinking that Bob can't hear 'cause he's, he's an old guy. I said to him again. Bob, get out of my face, get out of my face. He comes in closer to me again for the third time telling me you're not playing. His, his hat -- the brim of his hat hits my glasses, comes over the top. He's saying that I came up with my right arm and hit him in the This is not true. In my right arm is my racquet. I don't want to use my racquet, so I'm right handed. So the only option that I had is get him away from me and then go to the management downstairs is to come up with my left hand and put it over the top of his forehead 'cause he's saying you're not playing in my face and I started to push him back. He came around and he cracked me between the eyes with his racquet with the edge. That policeman gave testimony that I was, I was bleeding. He didn't say I was bleeding. He said that I had damages to my head. this point I was blacked out. Everything was black and all of a sudden I'm thinking to myself I'm in the middle of a fight. At that point I came around with my right hand and my left hand was already up there,

and I'm pushing him back away from me to create that space that's necessary. I'm pushing back. There was no more physical hits or anything, but I presume when I saw the damages to the back of his head that I couldn't do -- my racquet never touched him. it because there was a pool of blood on the floor that I hit him with my racquet. But six, seven months later when I finally got pictures and when I looked at the pictures the gash was on the back of his head. That means he bashed his head going through the doors and pulling up and/or (inaudible - 00:16:05) on the floor. You should have pictures there. Okay. at that point I start to come back around because I've been hit right on the top of my forehead and I have my own daughter here to testify that I have a scab and red mark between my -- on my forehead at my hairline. I started to come around. I walked into the courtroom over the top of Bob and I said to Bob you ought to learn some manners. You see the point is even if there was a warmup game, when Chris told me he didn't want to play I was the only one left to play and that's why everybody is yelling at Bob I'm the next one to play. There were other events for two years I've been putting up with Bob. One time Bob did this one.

When I walked up -- I walked back out of the courtroom a gentleman asked me to come in and play with him and Paul started (inaudible - 00:17:25) to make sure that I wasn't continuing with him. He wrestled around with me, and here's where he was (inaudible - 00:17:34). I started pushing away and he says no, wait, Russ. Stop. Calm down. And I said Bob -- or no, I said Paul and he said to me Russ, come and sit down. And I said of course. We sat down. He says what's going on, and I said I don't know, man. I just got up to go in and play this game. You see what Bob -- he was being polite and really concerned about this. There's a sign on the wall in Las Vegas Athletic Club. It says be polite and courteous to your fellow players. always conducted myself in that manner. Bob should have gone down to management. That's what I'd do. He never gave me that opportunity to do that because he cracked me right over the head. I never -- once we got to that part my attorney and I realized when we looked at the pictures we're going well Russ where did you hit him? (Inaudible - 00:18:35). He's claiming

1 that I hit him with my right hand. My racquetball was 2 in my right hand. If he's that close to my face, my 3 right hand is not going to come up and hit him because 4 you can't come in there. He's that close to me. And 5 this is the part to understand. All racquetball 6 players go into the courtroom in the court where 7 there's room. In there is where it's decided. 8 Somebody extra comes in. Everybody talks about it and 9 they go oh you're out. And if I'm out, I always walk 10 out. But everybody was screaming at Bob. I never hit 11 him, Your Honor. But I didn't know because at that 12 moment with that officer I couldn't say that. 13 still kind of blacked out and dazed worrying about did 14 I do something wrong, but while I was in jail for a 15 day and a half, two days I could think about the 16 events. Bob was gunning for a confrontation with me. 17 Otherwise, he would have gone to management --

Because Bob came out of the court and got into my face because he wanted to tell me you're not playing, and he's the one that struck me first. I have a right to be able to get somebody off of my face when they come into it.
